Twisdenwood Farm, 240 Andover Street, Georgetown, MA 01833

From Route 95 South take exit 53B (Route 97-Georgetown). Continue on Route 97 for approximately 4 miles until you come to your first set of traffic lights(gas station will be on your right). At this light, take a left and bear left onto Route 133 West. Follow 133 west for approximately ¾ mile. Twisdenwood is at the top of the hill on your left

From Route 95 North take exit 54, Route 133 west, Georgetown, Go 1.5 miles to light in Georgetown center. Take left at light to continue on Route 133 West. Route 133 West bears off to the right almost immediately after the turn. Stay on Route 133 west for 1 mile and farm entrance is on the left.

From Route 495S - take exit 43 (Mass Ave Exit). Bear right off the ramp and follow to the intersection of Route 125/133. At the light take a left and follow 133/125 for approximately 4-5 miles. You will come to a light with a Chinese restaurant on the left. Go through the light and take your next right (staying on Route 133 east). Follow for approximately 6-8 miles. USEF MEMBERSHIP STATEMENT
2011

Life, senior active and junior active members shall be eligible to participate in all classes at Regular Competitions, Eventing Competitions at the Preliminary Level or above and Combined Driving Competitions at the Advanced Level, Dressage, Reining and Vaulting Competitions and Endurance Rides provided the respective breed/discipline dues or breed/discipline category fee has been paid. A nonmember may participate as a handler, rider, driver, owner, lessee, agent, coach or trainer at Regular Competitions, Eventing Competitions, Dressage Competitions, Reining Competitions and Combined Driving Competitions upon payment of a \$20 nonmember registration fee and a \$5 breed/discipline category fee for each breed/discipline. Participants in the following classes are exempted from the Requirements of this rule: 1) leadline; 2) exhibitions; 3) games and races; 4) classes for 4-H members; 5) walk trot and academy classes (academy classes are classes limited to horses used regularly in a lesson program); 6) USDF introductory level tests, pas de deux and quadrille classes; 7) NRHA Endorsed Reining Competitions; 8) Opportunity classes. 9) citizens of other nations who have proof, in English, of current membership in good standing of their own National Federation, 10) USEA beginner novice division; and 11) assistant handlers in Dressage Sport Horse Breeding classes.

USEF FEDERATION ENTRY AGREEMENT

By entering a Federation-licensed Competition and signing this entry blank as the Owner, Lessee, Trainer, Manager, Agent, Coach, Driver, Rider, Handler, Vaulteur or Longeur and on behalf of myself and my principals, representatives, employees, and agents, I agree that I am subject to the Bylaws and Rules of The United States Equestrian Federation and of the competition. I will accept as final the decision of the Hearing Committee on any question arising under the Rules, and agree to release and hold harmless the competition, the Federation, their officials, directors, and employees for any action taken under the Rules. I represent that I am eligible to enter and/or participate under the rules, and every horse I am entering is eligible as entered. I also agree that as a condition of an in consideration of acceptance of entry, the Federation and/or the competition may use or assign photographs, videos, audios, cable-casts, or other likenesses of me and my horse taken during the course of the competition for promotion, coverage or benefit of the competition, sport, or the Federation. Those likenesses shall not be used to advertise a product and they may not be used in such a way as to jeopardize amateur status. I hereby expressly and irrevocably waive and release any rights in connection with such use, including any claim to compensation, invasion of privacy, right of publicity, or to misappropriation. The construction and application of Federation rules are governed by the laws of the State of New York, and any action instituted against the Federation must be filed in New York State. See GRI502.5.

MOTORIZED VEHICLE STATEMENT

Minors who do not have a valid driver's license which allows them to operate a motorized vehicle in the state in which they reside will not be permitted to operate a motorized vehicle of any kind including, but not limited to golf carts, motorcycles, scooters, or farm utility vehicles on the competition grounds of recognized competitions. Minors who have a valid temporary license may operate the above described motorized vehicles as long as they are accompanied by an adult with a valid driver's license. Violations of this rule will be cause for sanctions against the parent(s), guardian(s), and/or trainer(s) who are responsible for the child committing the offense. Penalties may include exclusion of the child, parent(s), guardian(s), and/or trainer(s) from the competition grounds for the remainder of the competition and charges being filed against any of the above individuals in accordance with Rule 6. Wheelchairs and other mobility assistance devices for individuals with disabilities are exempt from this rule.

RULES AND REGULATIONS

1. ENTRY FEES: \$20.00 Regular Classes, \$25.00 Stakes Classes, and \$30.00 for Medal Classes unless otherwise noted
2. Judges' decisions are final.
3. Any division with over 40 entries will be divided, with prize monies doubled. The Show Management reserves the right to further cancel, combine, or divide classes when deemed necessary to facilitate the smooth running of the show.
4. EVERY CLASS OFFERED HEREIN COVERED BY THE RULES AND SPECIFICATIONS OF THE CURRENT USEF RULE BOOK WILL BE CONDUCTED AND JUDGED IN ACCORDANCE THEREWITH. Classes not covered by USEF. rules to be run under the rules of the NEHC & MHC. USEF rules take precedence over rules of other organizations.
5. NSHA MEMBERSHIP: NSHA Annual Awards points accrue at each horse show for NSHA members. In performance classes, the owner/lessee of the horse must be a member, and in equitation classes, the rider must be a member. In addition, a NSHA lease form must be on file for all leased horses. Points will NOT count until membership is paid. Membership applications are available from the Show Secretary the day of the show or by writing to Mary Lynne Rahlson, 9 Flume Street, Concord, NH 03303 or visiting our website: www.northshorehorsemens.org
6. All classes will be judged on performance and soundness, unless otherwise noted. Championship and reserve ribbons in each division will be awarded in accordance with USEF rules.
7. Trophy and/or cash plus 8 ribbons will be awarded in each class unless otherwise noted. Prize money must be awarded at the Show Secretary's stand when entries are completely paid and MUST be picked up by the end of the show day. Prize money checks must be cashed within 30 days. **Prizes awarded in classes with 3 or more entries.**
8. To be eligible for stake classes, entrants must have shown in one other class in the same division. Failure to do so will result in forfeiture of entry fee and any prize awarded.
9. Courses consist of post and rails, walls, gates, pickets and brush fences.
10. Entries close the day before the show. Post entries will be charged a fee of \$10.00 for the day. No telephone calls will be accepted after 4:00 p.m.
11. Current negative Coggins Test is required.
12. All returned checks will be charged a \$30.00 fee, and entrants will not be allowed to compete unless all previous indebtedness to NSHA has been cleared. Any person or farm with more than two returned checks within a calendar year will be required to pay all fees by money order or cash for the balance of the year.
13. Refunds of entry fees will not be made unless a veterinarian or doctor's certificate of lameness, injury, or illness is shown. Refunds will be made if a class is cancelled.
14. Every animal entered for competition will be under control of the Horse Show Committee, but the NSHA show and its employees will in no case be responsible for any loss or damage that may occur. It shall be a condition of entry that each exhibitor shall sign the entry blank holding the show, USEF, and NEHC blameless for any loss, accident or decision which may occur.
16. ALL DOGS MUST BE LEASHED.

NSHA Membership Information

North Shore Horseman's Association, Inc. is a non-profit organization dedicated to supporting interest and education in horsemanship. To this end, we offer this series of Hunter and Pleasure horse shows with year-end awards in over 65 divisions with many special awards. We also award two \$500.00 scholarships.

Rules for annual awards

1. All horses/ponies competing in performance classes must be owned or leased by a member, whose current dues are paid, in order to accumulate points. **In addition, leased horses/ponies must have a current NSHA lease form on file with the NSHA in order to accumulate points.** All exhibitors competing in equitation classes must be a member whose current dues are paid, in order to accumulate points. Points for the NSHA Annual Awards will accrue only from the time membership dues are RECEIVED by the Show Secretary or Treasurer. NOTE: Children of Family Memberships must adhere to the rules of the USEF regarding Junior status.
2. Riders in all events, unless otherwise specified, may be either amateur or professional and are eligible for points, provided their current dues are paid.
3. Points shall be accumulated only during NSHA sponsored point shows according to published schedule.
4. There will be a championship trophy, reserve ribbon, and third and fourth ribbons presented to the competitors accumulating the most points in each respective division at the end of the season.
5. In order for a class or division to be eligible for an Annual Award, it must have been offered and run in more than half the number of shows offered.
6. Each competing horse, pony, or rider (in equitation classes) must show in the SAME point class in at least ONE MORE show than HALF the number of point shows offered and run to be eligible for Annual Awards. Example: If five (5) shows are offered and run, one must compete in at least three (3). Exception: If Management cancels a show after it has begun, then the horse/pony or rider will still receive credit for attendance at that show, provided they have completed an entry form and a number has been assigned. Limited Equitation/Pleasure: Any rider qualifying out of a limited equitation or pleasure division/class (examples: maiden equitation, novice equitation, limit equitation, limit pleasure) shall receive their accrued year-end points in that division/class, provided they continue to compete in at least one more than half the number of point shows offered and run as described above.
7. It will be the duty of the Show Committee to determine the eligibility of all competitors.
8. Questions and protests will be referred to the Show Committee whose decision is final.
9. Points will be scored as follows, regardless of Show Classification:

The top 4 riders, or 20% of the first round competitors, whichever is greater, are required to perform at least two individual tests from USEF tests 1-19. Children and Adults will compete together with the judge keeping the cards open until after the last competitor has ridden class #16. Each trip will be given a numeric score. The winner for each show will have the highest numerical score for the combined trip **The final NSHA Derby classes will be held mid-day Sept 18, 2011. The top 12 horses and ponies from the first 4 shows will qualify for the finals.**

The \$75 nominating fee is due at the first show. \$50 dollars of which will be added to the Derby pot.
